A painter who continues to explore "The Gritty Urban Landscape" as the subject for her journey from nature into the abstract, Broomer found inspiration for her recent works in the vista from the New Jersey Turnpike.

Women in Church and Ministry Lecture

“Wanted: Women in Ministry—Requirements: Susanna’s Faith, Vashti’s Courage, and Mary’s Obedience”

Lecturer: The Reverend LaVerne M. Gill, pastor and teacher at the Webster United Church of Christ in Dexter, Michigan, will give the annual Women in Church and Ministry Lecture. Gill has served at the Webster United Church of Christ since 1999, when she became the first African American and the first woman to serve as pastor in the church’s 175-year history. She has published four books, including *African American Women in Congress: Forming and Transforming History* (Rutgers University Press, 1997), has lectured around the country, and has appeared on a number of television and radio programs. Recently, she delivered a paper at the World Council of Churches and the Vatican’s conference African Contributions to the Religion of the World, titled “The African American Spiritual,” which was also presented at the Bossey Ecumenical Institute in Celigny, Switzerland. She is a 1997 M.Div. graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary and received her Th.M. degree from the Seminary in 1998.
